



SPA (3.7%) by Bath Ales boasts a wonderful golden colour and prominent citrus aroma. It's dry without harshness, light and crisp

Tinners (3.7%) by St Austells has a light refreshing flavour with only a hint of bitterness, ideal for revitalising the palate



Brassknocker (3.8%) by Matthews of Timsbury A Golden Ale with a citrus aroma full of fresh lemons and spicy orange zest. The mouth is filled with vanilla malt and left with a long and satisfying bitter finish.

Betty Stoggs (4%) from Skinners of Truro won the Champion Best Bitter of Great Britain award in the 2008 Great British Beer Festival. Classic pale amber mid strength bitter with distinct hoppy overtones.

Codrington Codger (4.2%) by Cotswold Spring . A dry, crisp, amber perfectly balanced beer with a mild hoppy finish



Zero Degrees Wheat Ale (4.2%) Often pale, traditionally cloudy, always refreshing and easy-

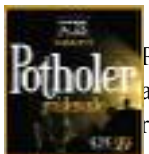
Ubley Ale (4.2%) by BBF - a special brew for our festival

Lady of the Lake (4.2%) by Glastonbury Ales. A full-bodied, amber best bitter.

Hopback Taiphooon (4.2%) - a pale gold beer with hints of lemongrass and coriander



Potholer (4.3%) by Cheddar Ales. This golden ale delivers zesty, fruity flavours with a smooth rounded finish and bags of aroma.

Sunrise (4.4%) Refreshing Pale Ale with a slight biscuity malt taste, strong citrus hop aroma and flavour from the Pioneer hops.

Dorset Gold (4.5%) by Palmers. A truly golden premium ale, refreshing and thirst-quenching, full, fruity and lightly hopped with Kent goldings

Barnstormer (4.5%) from Bath Ales. Rich in fruit with hints of chocolate, this full-bodied dark ale is a complex but deeply satisfying beer



Proper Job (4.5%) by St Austells - an authentic IPA brewed with Cornish spring water. A powerfully hopped golden bitter that explodes with citrus grapefruit flavours.

IPA (4.6%) by Zerodegrees. Copper coloured ale, similar to an English bitter, but in the style adapted by the craft-brewers of the U.S. west coast. Past Festival Winner.



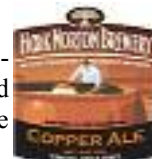
Classic Gold (4.6%) from Great Western, one of Bristol's newer breweries, set up in 2007. Golden, crisp clear and refreshing with lots of body, and a delicate floral aroma

Zerodegrees Black Lager (4.6%) - a deep dark Czech style lager, roasted and caramelised malts give chocolate and coffee flavours & a lasting cappuccino-style collar of foam



Elsie Mo (4.7%) by Castle Rock - golden hue, full body and pleasantly crisp aftertaste

Copper Ale (4.8%) by Hook Norton - a premium dark red ale with a strong, dry and slightly spicy palate and aftertaste



Summer Lightning by Hopback (5%) - an extremely pleasant bitter, straw coloured beer with a terrific fresh, hoppy aroma. This, coupled with an intense bitterness, leads to an excellent long, dry finish



East Street Cream (5.0%) by RCH. A full bodied beer with a malty hoppy fruit bitter and a sweet taste. A complex and well-crafted premium chestnut-coloured ale.

Palmer's 200 (5.0%). The palate of the beer is complex, a finely balanced blend of malt, hops and quenching citric fruitiness from the yeast



Stonehenge Ales' Danish Dynamite (5.0%) - A light golden, dry, strong ale, slightly fruity with a well balanced hop flavour and bitterness

Honeybear (5.2%) by Cotswold Spring - a honey wheat beer, smooth finish with honey noticeable in the aroma and taste but balanced with a blend of



Severn Sins (5.2%) by Severn Vale - a dark malty stout full of roasted barley

ESB (5.5%) from Fullers, has a rich mahogany appearance, bursts with cherry and orange, balanced by soft malty toffee and caramel notes. A smooth, mellow bitter finish.



Otter Head (5.8%) by Otter has a distinctive barley wine old ale character. It has a malt, fruit sweet flavour which gives way to a long bittersweet aftertaste. Has a well balanced aroma that reflects its taste and is deep red brown in colour.

Firebox (6.0%) from RCH. A reddish deep brown coloured beer which is a deceptively drinkable strong bitter with a fine combination of citrus hops and cherry fruit bittersweet flavours which gives a strong dry bitter finish.



Station Porter (6.1%) from Wickwar. A smooth, dark ruby brown ale with an aroma of roast malt, coffee and rich fruit. A multi-award winning porter with a complex and spicy, rich bittersweet taste.
